The East Anglia Transport Museum Society is a company limited by guarantee which runs the Museum. It was formed from a local transport group four decades ago. We now own the the museum site and adjacent house in Chapel Road. Members have the opportunity of participating in all aspects of Museum development.

There is scope for the individuals to make a great contribution, from general construction work, road making and gardening, helping with the Museum's bookshop and cafe to general administrative work - something for everyone in fact! In the summer months we also need people to operate the Museum such as driving and conducting as well as train crew for the railway.

We publish an illustrated colour quarterly newsletter to keep members in touch with Museum progress and Society business. During the winter months, when the Museum is closed to the public, work on improving the structure and exhibits is undertaken during organised working sessions.


The Society is always looking forward, towards increasing its membership.

The East Anglia Transport Museum was founded on its Carlton Colville site in 1965 and opened its doors to the public in 1972. The original aim was to preserve and display items of purely local transport interest, but this was soon widened, and today the Museum houses transport items which are nationwide in origin. It is a live working Museum where members of the public can, not only see, but also travel on the vehicles of yesteryear.

The Museum is unique in Great Britain in bringing together a working collection of vehicles from all fields of transport, whether they are powered by petrol, diesel, steam, electricity or even the horse. There are at present over forty exhibits including cars, commercial vehicles, motor buses, trolley buses, tramcars and municipal vehicles such as tower wagons and a steam roller. Many vehicles date from before the last war and the aim remains to fully restore all of them and to bring into working condition those which are, at present, non-runners.

In order to display the vehicles in their historical context we aim to surround them with a street scene of the pre-war era. In addition to all of this, there is a narrow gauge railway which, as well as containing many railway items of historic interest, provides an additional attraction and is particularly popular with younger visitors.

In recent years we have expanded our smaller exhibit collection, including displays on tickets, destination blinds and other ephemera.
